OUTREACH:

SENIOR CHAIR:

Let me start by saying what an honor it is to serve as your Senior Chair. I only hope that I can live up to your expectations and somehow make a positive impact on Senior Swimming in Indiana.

In December I contacted all the college coaches in Indiana and solicited their opinions on...

1. Is there a strong relationship between ISI and your university? Why or Why not? What can we do to improve the relationship and better utilize your expertise?
2. Are ISI and its clubs producing senior athletes that are capable of swimming at your university? What can we do to improve in this area?
3. Do you have any suggestions for potential long-range goals for the Senior Chair of Indiana Swimming?

I did receive a couple of well thought out and lengthy responses, but only a small handful of our College coaches took the time to respond. So at this time I have not accomplished one of my major goals, which is to establish a strong bond between the ISI Senior Chair and the States Collegiate Coaches. I will continue to work on this and hope that during the spring and summer the College coaches will be more accessible and I will have more time to access them.

I am also working (not real accurate. Tony is doing all the work, I just tell him what I think of his work. Thank You Tony!!) with Tony Young, TJ Day, Mark Hesse and several others on the ISI camps program for the next several years. I am very excited about this project and think it will provide a tremendous opportunity for the current and future stars of Indiana Swimming. The major goal on my side will be to solicit increased coach involvement in the camps. We are planning to offer 4 separate camps, plus the Swimposium. This means a lot of coach involvement and I would like to not only tap our proven coaching stars, but try to develop a new batch as well. I believe we have a tremendous group of coaches in Indiana. I want to try and use these clinics as not only education and motivation for the swimmers, but also for some of our up and coming coaches.

I have arranged to host an ASAC coaches clinic in Fort Wayne, next October. This will be geared primarily to assistant coaches, high school coaches and summer league coaches. I believe the primary coaches at most clubs get the education they need, but the coaches that really 'build our base' don't get the basic tools they need to provide us with great swimmers. This will be a 2 ½ day clinic and will be held at Homestead High School. The cost will be \$100 per coach. More details will be available as the winter season concludes.

At this point ISI does not have a host for Long Course Senior State. Again, Tony is doing all the work on this one, but I am very concerned and want to stay involved. Indiana's LC Senior state is one of the best meets in the Mid-west and I really want to see it hosted in a positive environment.

Well that's it. As you can see I haven't done much, but sit and talk a lot. I hope be able to give you a more substantive report at the next Board meeting.

SPORT DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR REPORT (Tony)

GENERAL

From November 17 to present my focus as Sport Development Director has revolved around such Special Events as the World Championship Trials, the Quad Meet, Swimposium and the Age Group Planning committee workshop. The World Championship Trials organization has taken quite a bit of time and may limit my club visits until spring. Continued office duties such as updating Times Database, Blast e-mails, sanctions and scheduling are ongoing. Special Projects include communicating with IHSAA and principals on the High School Moratorium issue, sitting in on the USA Swimming Club Development staff meetings, coordinating the proposed camps program and organizing the shipping of overseas donated equipment.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP TRIALS

Jeff Jarnecke of the IU Natatorium and I have taken on the responsibility of co-chairs of the sponsorship/marketing committee for the World Championship Trials meet. Jeff and I meet weekly and contact each other daily to coordinate the promotion of the meet, developing all sponsorship contact lists and contacting potential sponsors for cash sponsorships and VIK.

I met with Dale Neuburger, Larry McQueary, Justin Hirnisey and Connie Israel of the ISC staff to discuss marketing and sponsorship strategies. They were very willing to help us in any way possible with any sponsorship and VIK contact information needed. Larry has volunteered to be part of our marketing/sponsorship committee and has given us some contacts of "Friends of Swimming" that might be interested in assisting our efforts and leads on potential grants and marketing ideas.

Our contact lists include the Indiana Sports Corporation information from the World Swimming Championships. We have the list of organizations that purchased a sponsorship packages or donated VIK, the ISI mailing list, as well as over 5000 contact cards from people who visited the Hydro Zone at the World Swimming Championships.

A World Championship Trials brochure was developed and mailed out to over 1600 contacts which has started to stimulate ticket sales. Our first sponsor Sport Graphic donated the printing costs.

Arlene, Tina Mudd and I met to discuss the hospitality needs for the WCT. Since this is a very large portion of our budget both Jeff and I wanted to have a clearer picture of what type of VIK product needed so we might be able to solicit these items through sponsorship or donations.

6 different sponsorship packages have been developed with 4 very team friendly sponsorship packages. I will have a packet for each board member and will introduce these packages to the BOD on Monday night. Jeff and I will be contacting potential sponsors over the next few months.

Jeff and I will be promoting the meet at the IHSAA State Meets, Senior State and State Age Group by having an information booth in the concourse, information available at the Nat, hospitality, ticket booths, coaches' packets and heat sheets. Kent has developed promo spots as well for the video board. We propose ticket give-a-ways at each meet as well. We had a booth set up at the Quad meet and passed out over 500 pieces of information.

We will be asking each Indiana Swimming club to have a link on their website on the team web page and ask each team hosting an invitational to add our one page flier to local meet heats sheets.

Kent Nelson has the WCT website up and running complete with online ticket order information, meet/city information and sponsorship package information. He has been coordinating the ticket sales with Jim Kramer of the IU Natatorium staff.

Arlene, Julie McKenney and I traveled to Colorado Springs to meet with the USA Swimming staff to discuss the partnership and goals for the World Championship Trials meet with USA Swimming. The meeting was very helpful as both groups brainstormed opportunities that could make this a quality, entertaining and successful meet. Overall USA Swimming and the Indiana LSC better understands each groups needs and challenges while further building the relationship needed to host successful national meets.

The Advisory committee (Arlene, Julie, Jeff, Lynn and Tony) continues to meet on a regular basis to keep ahead of the game for LOC preparations.

Arlene hosted a Central Zone General Chairs conference call which provided an opportunity to ask the LSC's to assist in promoting the meet on their websites and at their state meets. Each LSC was offered 50 free tickets and \$2.00 off any additional sales from their LSC.

SPECIAL PROJECTS

IHSAA

I continue to communicate with the IHSAA and high school principals to discuss the summer moratorium week. I have asked the Club/HS coaches for feedback and with their input developed an athlete and coach survey with which we can summarize information and take it back to the IHSAA to give them insight into how the moratorium is affecting our sport.

This information will need to be back to the IHSAA by the end of January. It is very important that as many coaches and athletes as possible participate in providing feedback to have a good representation of the Indiana Swimming/HS membership.

Swimposium

The 05 Swimposium has limitless possibilities but a couple of venue concerns. I have contacted FINIS, NIKE and Daktronics to ask for contributions to our clinic. Daktronics is willing to contribute cash to assist with speaker honorariums but would like to have a booth and exposure on our website in return. I am in discussion with FINIS and NIKE to see if either group will supply speakers for the clinic or camps. They would both like to have a booth and or product demonstrations at the clinic in return.

Herein lays the problem. The best scenario would be to have a venue that had a traffic flow that pushed the crowds to the venue area. At present the University of Indianapolis pool has been our Indianapolis area option with meetings held in various off-sight locations. The NAT is not available on the date and Brownsburg high school/Swim Indy did not have an interest. IA has had an interest in hosting at Notre Dame. We need a vendor friendly location.

Speakers who are interested in participating at this time. Milt Nelms would be interested in presenting a coaches track on Friday night, Saturday and an optional Sunday. Milt has worked with many Olympians and has an excellent program on athlete development that is beneficial to all levels of coaches. Mike Lewellyn from KC Blazers (head age group coach) can speak on a number of topics including parent education. Mike is a former USA Swimming Club Development staff member. Randy Julian of USA Swimming is the Central Zone Club Consultant is happy to conduct the Club Leadership School.

Camps

We have 3 potential hosts for two one day USA Swimming "Catch the Spirit" camps and the Age Group Memorial Day camps. USA Swimming will let us know what dates are available for the OTC Altitude training camp by the end of January.

The next camp coordination meeting will be held Monday January 17 prior to the BOD meeting where the camp staff selections will be made and all camp goals and philosophies finalized for each camp. The goal is to start publicizing these camps by the end of January.

FINA Solidarity

I am making final arrangements to ship donated equipment from the NAT, ICAC and Mecklenburg Aquatic Club to needy overseas programs. It has been a chore finding boxes and donated shipping assistance. We are hoping that a former swim parents' connection with Fed Ex with help put the final pieces together.

MEETS

Assisted in set-up and operations for the Quad Meet and also promoted the World Championship Trials at the meet.

MEETINGS

I attended a meeting for Sports Marketing and public relations professionals arranged by Mayor Peterson's office to listen to the future strategies of the Indiana Convention Center and Indianapolis Colts facility.

As the expanded convention center and sport facility will be multi-use venues these facilities will be able to provide opportunities for larger and additional convention and sport related activities in the Indianapolis area.

One question did arise concerning building a new 1000 room hotel in the downtown area and how this will affect the Pan Am Building. Mayor Peterson's representative reassured the NGBs that all of these organizations are very important to Indianapolis and are at the forefront of the city's mind during these negotiations with the legislature. The Pan Am building is a privately owned property and as the value of the market increases, this could affect our location in the future.

Arlene and I met with Jay Chambers to discuss Jay's interest in becoming our next Outreach Chairman of Indiana Swimming and future goals and ideas for this position.

I have been working with Jireh Sports Academy to assist them in creating a swim lesion/water safety program for inner city youth. This is our first step in developing and outreach program with competitive swimming as a future goal.

I attended a CHAMPS program grant writing workshop to prepare a grant proposal for the Jireh Sports program. I am currently writing the proposal which is due next Tuesday.

USA SWIMMING/LSC

Attend by conference call, monthly meetings with the Club Development Staff that share information on observations and key issues from club visits. This last meeting was centered on the 10 top reoccurring problems for clubs that the CDD can find answers to.

I sat in on a conference call arranged by Arlene with the Central Zone officers to discuss future goals for the LSCs.

Participated in a conference call arranged by Arlene with the Central Zone Chairs to discuss future goals and promote the World Championship Trials.

Continue to conference call with the Age Group Planning committee to continue to organize the Age Group Chairs workshop proposed for April 22-24 in Colorado Springs. Brad Smith our Indiana Age Group Chair will be our representative at this workshop.

High School Moratorium

Tony is compiling information from the surveys he's received. The goal is to work with the IHSAA on flexibility of dates.

ACTION ITEMS

- Approval of Jay Chambers as Outreach Coordinator
PASSED. His contact information will be included in the BOD list for future meetings and a BOD list (always available from Lynn).
- Summer 2005 Senior State: Still no host. If no host by Friday, January 21, 2005, the Board will have to host. Host receives \$7,500 as per the 2005 budget. Any discussion about increasing the stipend for the Senior host needs to take place in AUGUST before the Budget meetings. A comment was made that some clubs may choose to skip out on Senior State if the meet were not at the Natatorium, the alternate sites that don't have sufficient warm-down facilities. A conglomerate of Indianapolis-area clubs has agreed to host the Senior State meet.
- Relay Time Standards: Following the adoption at the September 2004 HOD meeting for the inclusion of both the 400 Free Relay and the 400 Medley Relay for the 13-14 age group at Age Group State, we needed to include a standard for the 400 Free Relays (the 400 Medley relays were already there for 200 Medley proofs). The times that Scott Ingram proposed were considered and Scott was asked to compare to the add-up of the 100 freestyle cut and the standards he proposed and generate time standards that would be half-way between the two. Standards were completed in time to include on the website.
- Fiscal Year Change-Lucy asked for the Board's approval to change our Fiscal year to match our USA Swimming year (September 1 - August 31). Lucy since inquired of and filed extension paperwork for our 990 for 2004 (Sept. 2003-August 2004). After World Championship Trials and tax season, Lucy will file our 990.
- License Plate Fundraiser-Tony presented information regarding the Indiana Swimming license plate project. We would probably be granted approval as our organization is an educational group under the IRS and Indiana tax codes. However, we would have to pay up front for 500 plates. This item was tabled due to the high number of plates we had to guarantee.

MEETING NOTES

Participants: Amanda Bryant, Rod Davis, Dean Ekeren, Wendy Ethridge, Jim Harvey, Candi MacConaugh, Mike Unger, John Walker, & Chuck Wielgus – *USA Swimming*; Arlene McDonald, Julie McKenney, & Tony Young – *Indiana Swimming*.

Introduction

- Meeting participants introduced themselves.
- Chuck welcomed those present and inquired about the purpose of the meeting.
- Arlene clarified that since this event is one of USA Swimming's three premier events in 2005, the primary purpose of this meeting was to guarantee that the planning of the local organizing committee would meet or exceed USA Swimming's expectations for the event. Additionally, when hosting a meet, the Indiana swimming community always seeks ways to improve the staging of the event and "take it to the next level." To accomplish this, the local organizers desired to sit down with the key staff members from both organizations to create the collaboration to enhance this effort.

Goal Recognition

- When asked about Indiana's financial goal for the event, Arlene stated that the Indiana's desire in hosting the event is not financial, but rather is to promote the sport of swimming and continue the momentum generated by the 2004 Olympic Trials and 2004 FINA World Championships. While making a profit is always desirable, this is not an issue as long as the host can at least break even financially.
- Chuck explained that USA Swimming's vision for their events is twofold: (1) to run a technically flawless event and (2) to put on a great show. He explained that the greatest challenge is to put on a great show especially since many times the local media "don't get it." It is also many times difficult for those two goals to work together or "mesh" as different constituencies (participants and fans) at an event may have different expectations.

Sponsorships

- Seating for sponsors: Amanda inquired about the plans are for the seating of USA Swimming sponsors. There will be reserved seating at the start end for USA Swimming sponsors. Amanda said that reserving 25 seats for this purpose should be satisfactory.
- The meet host can use any space above the spectator chair rail for local sponsor recognition – banners, signs, etc.
- Dean asked that the host reserve two events per evening for awards presenters from national sponsors. Local sponsors or local celebrities can serve as presenters for any other events that evening. The local host will submit an awards presenter schedule to Dean for approval, and Dean will fill in the two USA Swimming awards presenters each day.
- National sponsors are guaranteed exposure on the video board and public address system.
- Toyota and 24 Hour Fitness should be added to USA Swimming's banner rights sponsor list.
- The host can solicit local sponsors that conflict with USA Swimming's "banner right" sponsors. However, there can be no deck advertising for local sponsors.

Promotions, Marketing, Event Enhancements

A lengthy brainstorming session related to “putting on a great show” generated the following decisions and suggestions.

- There will be no TV coverage of the event. TV is an expense item, and the economics do not support TV coverage. Also, network or ESPN is a challenge since swimming doesn't have a “season” that the media can follow or a series that we can sell. TV coverage is a risk for the organization because of its cost. (Rod)
- “Great Show”: Make it a great show for the people who are there and the media. Highlight the entertainment aspect by using lights, music, and video. (Chuck)
- Don't make the event something that it is not. Reach out to the swimming community and market to families. Market through surrounding LSC's by creating “Spring Break” and “Weekend” ticket packages. Offer local LSC's up to 50 free passes to encourage family/swimmer attendance. Market according to who is swimming when based on the order of events. (Rod)
- Have a promotional piece or “theme” (Chuck)
 1. “1st Significant Meet on the Road to Beijing”
 2. Have an educational component related to the theme – cross word puzzles, daily trivia contests, etc.
- Piggyback with the Women's NCAA Final Four
 1. Use Final 4 Teams as guests to present awards
 2. Offer programs that use NCAA coaches who are in town for the event
 3. Offer ticket packages that compliment the NCAA game schedule
 4. Work with NCAA organizing committee to promote each other's events
- April Pools Day (Rod)
 1. There will be national presence at an Indianapolis location on Friday, April 1 (Rod)
 2. Possible free nationwide lessons programs on Saturday, April 2
 3. May have national elementary school contest to see who wins a pool party
- Splash Magazine – It is difficult to coordinate pre-meet information with deadlines (Amanda). There will be coverage of results and pictures after the event.
- Sponsor programs to have school kids present at event at no cost– particularly prelims

Athlete Appearances and Promotions

- 800-1000 athletes are expected
- Work with Speedo to create an “athlete component.” Rod and Amanda will spearhead this effort with Speedo and will get back with meet host by **February 1** to report on the possibilities. (Rod)
- Play up the Phelps factor. (Mike)
- Create a “buzz” to get people to attend the event. What is the “hook” or “anchor” that would draw people to the event? Getting big-name athletes “up close and personal” with the audience is the key.
 1. Have nightly promotions such as: “Michael Phelps Cap Night,” “Natalie Coughlin Goggle Night,” “Brendon Hansen Bobblehead Night,” “Aaron Piersol Poster Night,” etc. (Chuck)
 2. Sponsor a morning “Breakfast with Champions” or “Lunch with Champions.”

3. Find a site for autograph session and schedule one hour after prelims every day. Possibly have a tent on the south grassy area where lunch is served. A lunch ticket gets a person into the autograph session.
 4. Before finals, have “ask an athlete” night where audience or “club for the day” members submit questions
 5. Conduct “on deck” interviews & post-race interviews: A USA staff member could assist with this (John)
 6. Have athlete interviews/appearances for “club of the day”
- Have a reunion of “Wall Athletes”
 - Make use of retired athletes – autograph session, interviews, etc. Go through their agents. (Note: Host needs list of potential retired athletes)
 - It is OK for host to use names and pictures of athletes for meet promotions –flyers, website, ads, etc.as long as it is not used for resale value. (Rod)
 1. Use “scheduled to appear” when referring to athletes
 2. It is preferable to use Speedo athletes in promotions.
 - National Team division will solicit athlete participation and notify host by **mid-January** regarding which national team athletes will be competing. It is expected that 99% of National Team athletes will participate as athlete assistance is based on this meet. (John & Candi)
 - Be sensitive to athlete competition when planning athlete promotions.

Merchandising

- Vendors should be identified by **mid-January** (Amanda)
- Speedo selects swimwear vendor
- Toyota might request a booth
- Pre-Event Merchandise Sale by Host: Will work with LOC and let them know by **mid-January** (Amanda)

Omega

- Finish line cameras on a truss (not poles) will be used. (Dean)
- Live timing will be in effect just as at Olympic Trials (Dean)
- Omega set-up should be complete before the venue opens for practice (Dean) Therefore, Omega should be there to accept their own equipment.
- Mike Gibbons, Guy’s father, now works for Dak, so there should be no issues between them and Omega

Venue/Facility

- Host can tie into race analysis cameras for viewing on the video board.
- USA swimming would like to see pre-race, start, and post-race through host cameras on scoreboard with underwater race analysis cameras in between.
- Dean will facilitate a list of deliveries.
- Wireless Internet can be made available (Julie)
- Speedo would like additional storage at the facility (Amanda). This will be a challenge. (Julie)
- USA Swimming will need a location for team processing. (Candi) The old mail room can be used for this purpose. (Julie)
- USA Swimming requests enhancements to the facility sound system (Mike)
- USA Swimming requests an enhanced security plan. (Candi)
 1. Request for better security at the top of the east deck stairwell

2. Need separate, controlled ingress and egress points for Olympians; another for other athletes
3. Be sure to provide the details of the security plan to coaches at the technical meeting.

LOC Website

- Host cannot broadcast video on event website. (Rod)
- Can broadcast inside the venue
- Will be an underwater camera that can be used to broadcast only inside the venue.
- There needs to be a link from USA Swimming website to event website. (Chuck) Work with Wendy to accomplish this.
- Event host can link to Omega live timing.
- Is Indiana swimming ticket information on USA Swimming website? (Chuck) Not at this time; one-page flyer will be sent to Wendy to post.

Awards

- The World Championship team can be introduced and recognized on the last evening (Tuesday). (John)
- Top 8 finishers will be receiving awards.
- High point awards will be given at the last evening session (Tuesday)

Media

- USA Swimming's media staff will be at the event.
- All pre-meet media credentials go through USA Swimming.

On-Site Credentialing

- Host will create an on-site "Request for Credentials" form.
- Dean will need to sign off on these requests at the event.

Officials

- In all likelihood, the meet referee will be Ron Van Pool. (Dean)
- Unsure of the timeline for the assignment of other officials. (Dean)
- Host would like to have list as soon as possible to facilitate officials' needs.

Meet Information Book

- Will be ready for approval soon.

Event Logo

- Not ready at this time. (Amanda)

Closing Comments

- Thank you to Chuck & USA Swimming for facilitating this meeting. The consensus was that it was very beneficial for both organizations.
- Chuck asked Indiana to be the catalyst to keep them involved to accomplish the tasks discussed today.

USA Swimming Privacy Policy

Information concerning members of USA Swimming acquired during the registration process is the property of USA Swimming and its use is within the control of USA Swimming. USA Swimming strictly limits the use of member's personal information to that information necessary for the conduct of the business of USA Swimming and its LSCs.

To clarify the issue of publishing information regarding USA Swimming members by USA Swimming and its LSCs, the Board of Directors of USA Swimming has approved the following policy:

The following information, and only the following information, shall be acceptable for publication in any form, including but not limited to the world wide web, regarding any USA Swimming member without express written authorization from the athlete, if of majority; the athlete's parent/guardian, if a minor; or the non-athlete member:

name,
age in years,
club affiliation,
time and place, and
any awards or honors.

USA Swimming membership numbers may be published when done for data transmission only. USA Swimming membership numbers may not under any circumstance be published together with the name of the member or in a series of reports that when taken together will reveal the name and membership number of the member.

The foregoing policy shall be effective immediately. All LSCs need to review their publications and website to determine if there is any information published therein which is not permitted pursuant to this policy, such as member's address, telephone number, birth date or USA Swimming ID number. If prohibited information is published, the LSC needs to take steps to remove the information by May 1, 2005 or sooner.
