## **OFFICIALS**

All officials will be selected and assigned by the IN Swimming Officials Committee. Those interested in officiating these championships must fill out the online application to officiate located on the Officials page of the IN Swimming website.

## **RULES**

- Current USA Swimming and Indiana Swimming rules, including the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy (MAAPP 2.0), will govern the meet.
- Requirements and Conditions for Sanction and Approval: USA Swimming rules 202.3, 202.4, and 701.2.
- It is understood and agreed that USA and Indiana Swimming shall be free from any liabilities or claims for damages arising by reason or injuries to anyone during the conduct of the event.
- No swimmer will be permitted to compete unless the swimmer is a member as provided in Article 302.

- At a sanctioned competitive event, USA Swimming athlete members must be under the supervision of a USA Swimming member coach during warm-up, competition, and warm-down.
- Only swimsuits complying with FINA Open Water swimsuit specifications may be worn in USA Swimming sanctioned or approved Open Water Competition, USA Swimming rule 701.4.
- Deck changes are prohibited.
- Operation of a drone, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over the venue (pool, athlete/coach areas, spectator areas, and open ceiling locker-rooms) any time athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present.
- Use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms, USA Swimming rule 305.3.
- An inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in any public place where people are present. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to sever illness and death. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, senior citizens and individuals with underlying medical conditions are especially vulnerable.
- Safe Sport 360: The Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy prohibits Adult Participants (as defined) from having one-on-one interactions with minor athletes which are not within an observable and interruptible distance from another adult. Adult Participants are required to abide by this policy in full during this meet.
- Pursuant to USA Swimming Rules and Regulations and federal law, it is every member's responsibility to immediately (i.e., within 24 hours) report any incident of child abuse, including physical or sexual abuse, to law enforcement and the U.S. Center for SafeSport. Reporting must occur when an individual has firsthand knowledge of misconduct or where specific and credible information has been received from a victim or knowledgeable third party. A report to the U.S. Center for SafeSport may be made via telephone at 833-5US-SAFE (833-587-7233) or online at www.uscenterforsafesport.org/report-a-concern. Various state laws may also require reporting to law enforcement or to a designated child protection agency.

• All athletes aged 18 and older must complete Athlete Protection Training in order to be a USA Swimming registered member in good standing. Any athlete who turns 18 on or before June 24, 2025, who has not completed Athlete Protection Training by the first day of competition, will be prohibited from participating in the competition until such time as all membership requirements are completed. Times achieved by an athlete who turns age 18 on or after June 24, 2025 who competes in this USA Swimming sanctioned event without completing this membership requirement, will NOT count for qualification or recognition. This includes participation as a member of a relay.

# INDIANA SWIMMING BROADCAST POLICY AND IMAGE AUTHORIZATION

## **Broadcast Statement**

Any photographs, videotape or other audio and/or visual recordings of the event created by a spectator may be used solely for such spectator's personal non-commercial use, and may not be broadcast, published or disseminated, or used for any commercial purposes, without the prior written consent of Indiana Swimming.

# **Image Authorization**

All participants agree to be filmed and photographed by the official photographer(s) and network(s) of Indiana Swimming and the meet host under the conditions authored by Indiana & USA Swimming, and allow event organizers the right to use names, pictures, likenesses, and biographical information before, during or after the period of participation in this Indiana Swimming competition to promote such competition.

## **ENTERING THE MEET**

#### **QUALIFYING PERIOD**

Times must be achieved from January 1, 2024, through the modification deadline on June 18, 2025.

## **ELIGIBILITY**

- All swimmers, coaches, and officials must be registered members of USA Swimming registered in the Indiana Swimming LSC.
- A swimmer's age will be their age as of June 24, 2025
- All entry times must fall within the qualifying standards for that event.
- Swimmers submitted times may not be faster than a provable time.
- A submitted entry time that cannot be proven by proof/scratch deadline for the event will result in a swimmer's seed time reverting to the fastest qualifying time recorded in SWIMS for the qualifying period. If no qualifying time is available in SWIMS and no proof is brought by event scratch deadline, then the swimmer will be scratched from the event.
- Swimmers with a disability wishing to compete in these championships must submit the Inclusion of Swimmers with Disabilities form before the deadlines listed in the document.
- ISI will reimburse entry fees for swimmers registered with an Outreach membership after the event.

# **ON-SITE REGISTRATION**

There will be no on-site registration for this event.

## **ENTRY**

- Swimmers may enter one individual event and be included on a relay if the team has 3 or more swimmers entered.
- Relays will be contested after the individual events with 3 swimmers each completing 400M (1 lap) of the course each Teams must enter relay teams through the team entry.
- The TM/TU setup file has all qualifying distance listed. Swimmers should be entered in only one of the distances.

## **ENTRY FEES**

- \$22.00 Athlete Surcharge
- \$20.00 per individual event entry
- \$10.00 per relay entry
- The total amount of all fees due for entered events, including any fines incurred for late entry, shall be

submitted to the meet host no later than one hour prior to the start of the competition or the entire team will be scratched from the meet. The Summary of Entries form must be included with payment.

 No refunds will be issued for events scratched after the modification deadline.

## **ENTRY DEADLINES**

- It is the responsibility of the entering team/unattached swimmer to heed all deadlines and be responsible for the accuracy of team entries.
- ENTRY DEADLINE: 11:59 PM on Monday, June 16, 2025 (Eastern Time)
- MODIFICATION/LATE ENTRY DEADLINE: 11:59 PM on Wednesday, June 18, 2025 (Eastern Time)

#### **LATE ENTRY**

- Teams/unattached swimmers and relays that neglected to enter an event(s) by the entry deadline can enter up until the modification deadline of Wednesday, June 18 at 11:59 PM.
   Teams/unattached swimmers entering late will be
  - assessed a late fee of \$30 per individual entry and \$20 per relay entry.
- No entries or modifications will be accepted after the Wednesday, June 18 modification/late entry deadline.

# **VERIFICATION/PROOF OF TIME**

- All times will be verified by Indiana Swimming.
   Proofs of time are required to be submitted with the team entry through the online entry form.
- Acceptable verifications are official results in PDF form from:
  - USA Swimming sanctioned or approved meets listed with the meet name and date;
  - College, High School, Junior High, YWCA or YMCA meets sanctioned by their respective governing organizations;
  - Websites, provided that the host address is printed on the copy;
  - Meet Mobile or Live Results with visible meet and date headers;
  - Verification slips, time cards, timing system tapes or photocopies of such which are signed and dated by the referee;
  - Official results from USA Swimming meets must be printed with either host team's name or the facility in which the team was run on each page.

## **MEET FORMAT & PROCEDURES**

#### **FORMAT**

The competition will be organized according to the following age classifications.

- 10 & Under 400M (1 Lap)
- 11-12 800M (2 Laps)
- 13-14 1200M (3 Laps)
- 15 & Over 1600M (4 Laps)
- All Relays 1200M (1 lap per athlete)

## **TIMING**

Timing chips worn by the competitors on their ankle will be used for these championships.

# **CHECK-IN PROCESS**

Athletes will check-in and complete the following stations:

- Athlete check-in where swimmers will receive their competitor number. The supplied numbering card must be retained as this will be part of the prerace check-in and post-race check-out.
- Athlete numbering where their competitor number will be written in marker by meet personnel on both shoulders, the back of each hand, and on the athlete's back.
- 3. Checking and trimming of finger and toenails. It is preferred that this is done before arriving on site.
- 4. Swimsuit inspection

## **WARM-UP PROCEDURES**

A warm-up area will be available starting at 7:45 AM and will remain open throughout the competition. The warm-up area will be marked and monitored by a lifeguard.

#### START/FINISH

All starts will take place in the water and all finishes will be on the beach.

All age groups will be stagger-started with the boys event going first, followed by the girls event. Each age group will finish their race before the next age group begins.

#### SAFETY PROCEDURES

The race is under the purview and discretion of the Meet Referee, Meet Director, and Independent Safety Monitor and can be stopped by any of these individuals.

# **Mandatory Clinic**

There will be a mandatory clinic for all swimmers and coaches held before competition begins to discuss the course, rules, and safety procedures. Swimmers not attending the clinic or who are inattentive to the race procedures presented during the clinic will not be allowed to participate in the race. The Meet Referee has sole discretion to prevent swimmers from competing. Following the safety briefing, role call will be taken and the athletes will move to their race starting position. Swimmers will report directly from the clinic to the race, so they should bring everything necessary to the clinic with them.

# **Swim Caps**

Swimmers should wear their team caps during the event.

## **Unescorted Swims and Safety**

- This is an unescorted swim, USA Swimming rule 701.2.
- The course will be patrolled by certified lifeguards.
- EMS will be on site during the meet.
- A Dive and Rescue team will be on site during the event

#### Abandonment

If danger occurs before the start of the event, the race will be postponed until conditions warrant, or the race will be cancelled.

If in the event of an emergency, a race is required to be halted prior to its completion, the race will be restarted from the beginning or declared complete at the discretion of the Meet Referee, Meet Director, and Independent Safety Monitor.

# **Time Limit**

Per USA Swimming rule 701.2.7, all athletes shall complete the event within 30 minutes from the finish time of the first swimmer. Any athlete who has not completed the race in that time period will be removed from the water and disqualified as "did not finish."

# Water Temperature

Water temperature will be measured as prescribed by USA Swimming. If the water temperature is 68 degrees Fahrenheit or colder, the threshold for wetsuits, the event will be cancelled.

## **Water Quality**

Water quality will be tested as prescribed by USA Swimming and the local health department. If contaminants are not in the normal range and the health department does not recommend swimming, the event will be cancelled.

Contingency Plan for Weather

- Option 1 complete individual events and cancel relays.
- Option 2 shorten individual events and cancel relays to get all athletes on the course.
- Option 3 meeT host will discuss with meet ref and coaches to determine if meet can be run or needs to be canceled.

## **MEET CONDUCT**

#### **RULES**

- This meet will be conducted in accordance with USA Swimming and Indiana Swimming Open Water rules and regulations.
- Athlete conduct will be governed by Part Seven of the USA Swimming Rules and Regulations Handbook. Intentional obstruction, interference or intentional contact with another swimmer may be deemed "Unsporting Impedance" and lead to disqualification.
- Parents and swimmers should be advised that if there are a significant number of entrants, open water swimming may be expected to involve inadvertent contact with other swimmers. It is important that swimmers keep a cool head while in the water.

## **POSITIVE CHECK-IN**

- Any swimmer not checked in by the deadline for their age will be scratched from the competition.
- Any swimmer who checks in for the meet and decides to withdraw before the race must notify the Clerk of Course and return their competitor number.
- 13 & Over check-in: 7:30-8:30 AM. Any 13 & Over athlete not checked in by 8:45 AM will be scratched from the event.
- 12 & Under check-in: 8:45-9:45 AM. Any 12 & Under swimmer not checked in by 9:45 AM will be scratched from the event.
- Relay check in will be by relay cards due 30 minutes prior to the start of the relay events

#### SEEDING OF EVENTS

- Start list be generated by the following order:
   Short Course Yards Long Course Meters Short Course Meters (Y-L-S). No entry times will or should be converted for seeding.
- If the number of athletes entered in an event is large, the Meet Referee may create multiple heats in specific age groups for safety. The need for such heats will be determined by the Meet Referee based on the number of entered athletes and the layout of the championship course. If this determination is made, the procedures will be communicated to the teams prior to the competition. These heats will be seeded by using entry times to provide the best opportunity for competition.

#### **RELAYS**

- Teams submitting entries for three or more swimmers in an event will be eligible to enter a relay for that age group and gender.
- Relays will consist of three swimmers in the same age group and gender from the same team.

- Relays must be submitted with the team entry and may not be added on-site at the meet.
- Relay cards will be picked up at team check-in. Relays will be contested after the individual events with 3 swimmers each completing 400M (1 lap) of the course each

#### **SCORING**

Individual and relay events will be scored to 16 places as follows:


#### **AWARDS**
